- 1 Adjustment Factor** was previously known as Loss Factor. When electricity is delivered over a power line, it is normal for a small amount of power to be consumed or lost as heat. Equipment, such as wires and transformers, consumes power before it gets to your home or business. The adjustment factor accounts for these losses.
- 2 Delivery Charges** includes those charges previously known as Customer Charge, Distribution Charge, Transmission Connection Service Charge and Transmission Network Service Charge. These are the costs for delivering electricity from generating stations across the province to CNPI then to your home or business. This includes the costs to build and maintain the transmission and distribution lines, towers and poles and operate provincial and local electricity system.

A portion of these charges are fixed and do not change from month to month. The rest are variable and increase or decrease depending on the amount of electricity that you use.
- 3 Regulatory Charges** includes those charges previously known as Wholesale Market Service Charge and Administration Charge. These are the costs of administering the wholesale electricity system and maintaining the reliability of the provincial grid.
- 4 Debt Retirement Charge** pays down the debt of the former Ontario Hydro.
- 5 Historical Consumption.** As part of its commitment to conservation and energy efficiency, CNPI provides comparative usage data to enable its customers to monitor and conserve energy.
- 6 Energy Conservation Tip.** Your bill will contain energy conservation tips to help you lower your energy costs.
